From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, both the First Reading and Gospel offer us images of a banquet, an abundance of choice food and wine, reserved for God's faithful people. In the Gospel, however, Jesus uses the image, similar to last week's Gospel, of the vine grower and the vineyard workers, to challenge those in power who abuse the 'banquet' of God's all-encompassing love, instead clinging to and refusing to share with others the gifts that God has asked them to share.

No doubt we have an abundance of the abuse of political, religious and economic power in our world. Those focused on accumulating wealth, stature and political power for their own self-interest have rejected the message of Jesus that ALL creation is for ALL people, and that it is expected of those who have much to share with those who have little. Clearly, these are the ones that the Master, that is, Jesus, invites to the Feast first. But they do not think they need Jesus' riches – the riches of joy in this life and the promise of eternal life. They are blinded to the true gift that Jesus offers them.

So the Master/ Jesus asks his servants to go out and invite anyone and everyone to join in the Feast he offers. And they – the poor, the oppressed, prostitutes and taxpayers – accept the invitation, show up to the banquet, put on the necessary wedding garment given them to wear, and enter the Feast. In Jesus' parable, the Feast is not a feast of food, but a feast of the riches of coming to know the great gift and lifegiving taste of God's love, compassion, forgiveness and mercy. Once tasted, consumed and strengthened by it, they not only want more, but they naturally want to share it with others. They realize that the banquet of God's grace and mercy is endless that, in sharing with others, the gift is not diminished, but instead magnified, compelling us out of love to invite others to the feast.

There is a part at the end of the parable where one of the second group of invited guests refuses the wedding garment provided for him on his entry into the palace. This person symbolizes those who accept the invitation but refuse to honor the custom of wearing a wedding garment. This person refuses to do what all of us are required to do, as Paul tells us, to 'put on Christ' which signifies that we bear the mark of baptism and the anointing of the spirit to fully enter into the richness of God's lifegiving and eternal love.

My friends, we are offered this invitation every day, to 'put on Christ' to clothe ourselves in Christ's love as we, like these servants, go out every day and live our lives in ways that attract others to 'come and see' what brings us joy and strength. Have we fully accepted the invitation? Have we extended the invitation to others? If not, why not? Christ is waiting for our answer and willing to give us all we need to accept it.


