

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

There is an acronym that I reflect on every once and awhile, centered in the word JOY, J-O-Y. As we know, joy is not the same as happiness. Happiness is the byproduct of our actions or interactions with others or with nature. JOY is a virtue, something that we develop over time as, in the midst of the joys and hardships of life, we choose to be anchored in faith, hope and love to get us through.

I am reminded of the virtue of JOY by parishioners, many of whom have had very difficult lives due to systemic racism and great losses as well from drugs, guns and physical illness that is much more common in poor communities. In the midst of all of these trials, I still see JOY in them. Not happiness because life is still challenging, but JOY in knowing God is present in their lives in prayer, in Scripture, in the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus, and in a supportive faith community.

JOY as an acronym means Jesus, Others, and You! It's interesting how today's Gospel offers us Jesus' version of the Ten Commandments wrapped up nicely in the Two Great Commandments: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is equal to it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

We form a Holy Trinity – Jesus, Others, and You – when we can embrace true JOY in our lives. Embracing JOY in our lives can only happen if we have a relationship with God in Jesus Christ. When we are able to minimize our egos and more and more reject the temptations of the world, when we can develop and nurture the virtues of humility, kindness and generosity, when we can recognize the unique, wonderful child of God we are and who others are as well, true JOY will grow and flourish in our lives.

In our Gospel, the religious authorities who are trying to trap Jesus think he will raise up only the Jewish Shema from the Book of Deuteronomy: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." Orthodox Jews to this day wear a little leather box, called Tefillin, containing a tiny scroll with this verse. To fulfill their religious duty they must pause and recite this verse in homage to God.

In Jesus' response, he honors this by quoting it as the First Great Commandment. But then he catches them again in their attempt to say one is greater than the rest: "You must love your neighbor as you love yourself," or as I like to interpret it sometimes, "You must love your neighbor as God loves YOU!" Jesus has again called out their hypocrisy by saying that these two commandments together are THE greatest Commandment. To honor only ourselves and not honor our neighbor, especially the poor, dishonors God. This is exactly what they were doing. Giving lip service to God, dishonoring and neglecting the poor, and hording power for themselves. There clearly is no JOY in them because they feel threatened by Jesus' care and love for ALL people. The Good News for us is that we can claim JOY in our lives by deepening our personal relationship with Jesus Christ who loves us so much that we want to share that love with those closest to us, all in need and, really, all humankind. Take the time to embrace JOY in your life!

God of infinite compassion and boundless love, through the ages you call men and women, young and old, to model for us the virtues of humble strength and willing service. You have




