From the Desk of Fr. Larry... My brothers and sisters, Jesus seems to be throwing some very contradictory things at us in today's Gospel. Take, for example, his remarks to the crowds regarding some of the scribes and Pharisees, particularly those who prance about in their fancy religious garments and lord it over others. He is criticizing their arrogance and lack of real respect for the Law and the Prophets, that is, giving God the highest priority – and not themselves – AND caring for the poor.

At one point he says this to the crowds: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven." But wait a second, Jesus! We commonly refer to the male head of household as 'father,' and of course priests are often called 'father.' I have had people refuse to call me with the title 'father' because of their literal interpretation of this passage.

Does that mean we should never refer to men as fathers? Of course not. Jesus is exaggerating this emphasis. Yes, there is only one Father in heaven, the Father of all earthly fathers. What Jesus is emphasizing is for all of us to realize that no one, absolutely no one, is equal to the Father in heaven. Sadly, many men and women who call themselves fathers and mothers are not first looking to the Father in heaven to guide them how to be good fathers and mothers on earth. Good fathers and mothers humble themselves before the Father in heaven who seeks only to instruct, form and offer them the wisdom they need to be the best parents to their children and spouses to one another. God the Father longs for us to humbly accept these gifts, to pour them into us, so that we can fulfill all our unique roles in this life.

But here's the rub, my friends. There must be room in us to allow God to pour these gifts into us. If we are caught up in ego and power and superiority over others, there is no room for God. That's why I often remind our parishioners that, as we pray the Lord's Prayer together, we perhaps need to occasionally say, "Thy kingdom come, my ego go. Thy will be done, my will become Yours." We can easily say to God, "I desire for you to be a part of my life," but be unwilling to remove some of our personal and spiritual baggage that we cling to in order for God to have room to move in.

Then we get to the last part of the Gospel: "Those who humble themselves will be exalted." Again, we might say, "now wait again, Jesus! If I humble myself, then how am I exalted?" We might translate Jesus' words better this way: If we humble ourselves to recognize and embrace God's compassionate sovereignty in our lives, then we – God and us – are exalted, not in a superior way, but in a way that requires us to engage others to embrace this incredible lifegiving relationship with God. The month of November is a time the church invites us to remember those loved ones taught us in the ways of faith, who humbly offered their lives to the Father Who, in turn, helped them to be the best father, mother, grandparent, child or friend that they could be. We trust that they now dwell in eternal love with the Father, Son and Spirit and are present to us, especially in our weekly celebrations of the Mass. Gentle peace! Fr. Larry
