From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My sisters and brothers, one of my favorite cross-biblical references comes from Dr. King's I Have a Dream speech. "I have been to the mountaintop!" Dr. King talks about a transformative moment for him where God has given him the privilege to see God's vision for what humankind could and should look like in an ideal world. Along with that privilege also comes an awesome responsibility to share the vision and then to engage everyone, despite any challenges, in the work of transforming the world-as-it-is into the world-as-it-should-be.

In our First Reading today, Abraham is called to the mountaintop to prove his faith in God in what seems to be a horrible thing God would ask of Abraham or anyone: to sacrifice his only son! Abraham, who has been faithful every step of the way in his journey with God, is put to the ultimate test. God stops Abraham from sacrificing his son and, in return, grants Abraham descendants "as numerous as the stars in the skies."

In the Gospel we have Jesus, with his apostles Peter, James and John, going to the same mountaintop where Jesus is revealed by the Father to be His only beloved Son, having Moses and Elijah, symbolic of the law and the prophets, present to solidify the message that Jesus IS the fulfillment of the long tradition of the law and the prophets. The experience for Peter, James and John had to be extraordinary, both fearful and awesome. When all is said and done, however, with what they have experienced, they must now go and continue in helping fulfill the mission. Again, an awesome privilege AND responsibility.

For those of us who accept and embrace the love between Father, Son and Spirit in our lives, we are sometimes graced with these transformative/ transfiguration moments. One such experience for me was after about a 6 months as pastor of St. Agatha when I was celebrating Mass at St. Agatha, now St. Simon of Cyrene. As I was reflecting after the homily, I looked out at the congregation, many who I had come to know over these months, and I was struck deeply with the thought, "God, I love these people. I love this community. I can't imagine the pain in one day leaving this community." And I started to tear up. Truly a moment of grace for me, one that solidified my commitment to minister to and with the people of our great parish. A privileged moment, yet a moment that carried with it the responsibility to share the fullness of my gifts with the community. As I look toward stepping down as pastor in July, I still imagine myself supporting the work of the parish on the westside.

My friends, God gives us moments – grace moments, transfiguration moments – to fill us with joy that then invites us to carry that joy into our daily lives where the hope, love and joy we feel may touch others in their pain and struggles to know, without question, that God is present through, with and in us!
