

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, the Scriptures for today call us to recommit ourselves to the fullness of the Ten Commandments given by God to Moses to give to the people AND the Great Commandment summarizing the 10 given us by Jesus: Love God above all things and all relationships, and then fortified by the power of embracing the fullness of God's love for you, care for others, and for yourself, as you would desire God to care for you. Implied in this care is care for the physical, emotional and spiritual well-being of others and ourselves.

Lent provides us 40 days to refocus our priorities regarding our relationship with God, with ourselves, and with those closest to us and others who God places in our life path each day.

In the Gospel, Jesus calls out those who are using the Temple in Jerusalem as a marketplace, taking advantage of those who have come to Jerusalem from all over Israel to celebrate the great Feast of Passover. You can bet that those selling goods were supported by the religious authorities and that the government officials were getting a cut of the profits made off the backs of hard-working Jews.

Sadly, these forces still exist today as we see a rise in white evangelical Christian movements and Christian nationalists who use religious belief as a front for taking advantage of the poor and middle class and defining who God favors and who God condemns. In reality, authentic Christian disciples recognize that there is absolutely no one excluded from God's love. Therefore, as Pope Francis so much encourages us, we are called to meet people 'where they're at'. It is in these sacred encounters that we get to know each other, our hopes and dreams, our challenges and pains, our joys and sorrows. In building those relationships, we can then accompany each other on the journey to understand how each of us can best be life-giving to others with the gifts God has given us. Religion that begins with measures of who's in and who's out is already contrary to the Good News that Jesus is trying to teach: that ALL are included in God's plan, that ALL are precious in God's eyes, that ALL are sinners, yet All are capable of greatness in the eyes of God because God is always ready to forgive and then give us the grace to get back on track in fulfilling our God-given purpose in the world.

The Good News is that Jesus is always there to break down the barriers that prevent us from realizing our full potential. And He is there in a multitude of ways: through the Scriptures that teach and guide us; through the Body and Blood of Christ offered us at every Mass to fortify us; and, through fellow disciples of Christ and other people of good will who support us, encourage us, and who are willing to stand against the forces of power and greed that would seek to prevent us from fulfilling our God-given purpose in the world. We should never, never underestimate the power of WE, the People of God!
