

Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Dcn Pouncy.


**RCIA:** Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

## From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, listen to this quote from Jesuit priest John Foley: "the real value in life is to receive, not to grab and possess." Listen again: "the real value in life is to receive, not to grab and possess."

We know all too well that 'the world as it is' today focuses a lot on possessing things: power, wealth, the latest in technological gadgets, the latest fad in tennis shoes or fashion, the constant onslaught of advertising to buy things that we want rather than just those things with which we need to live uncomplicated lives focused on the MAIN THING: our relationship with God, with our loved ones, and with those who greatly need the resources we have to offer them, resources that God expects us to share with them.

The Good Shepherd in today's Gospel offers His sheep all that we need to live and thrive individually and as one flock united in solidarity of heart and mind with the Shepherd. The false shepherd is only in it for the money and is unlikely to invest himself in more than the minimum of care for the flock as long as he gets his wages at the end of the trail.

There are too many false shepherds out there, wolves in sheep's' clothing who all too easily 'pull the wool' over the eyes of followers by somehow convincing them that he really cares for them when, in reality, he or she will say or do anything they want to hear. This is obvious in our politics and, sadly, in our church institutions.

There is a wonderful story about a great orator who was speaking to a crowd of followers. Someone asked him to proclaim the 23rd Psalm, which he did with great passion, and the audience applauded resoundingly. But then the orator invited a pastor he knew to come up from the audience and asked him to proclaim the same Psalm. As he proclaimed it - really praying it – the people found themselves in tears as he ended the psalm. Someone asked the orator, "What was the difference between your recitation and the pastor?" The orator said to them, "I know the Psalm. The pastor obviously knows the Shepherd.

As we celebrate this traditional Good Shepherd Sunday, it is important for us all to understand that all we have and all we are is a gift from God. We can open our hands and let God pour into them whatever we really need. And if we keep your hands open, we can easily let what we have pass on to others, those who are without. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, is the source of everything. We are not sheep, mindlessly following the shepherd, but human beings always seeking to attune our hearts and minds and all of our senses to the voice and heart of the Good Shepherd. All else that we attach ourselves to in life is fleeting and will ultimately disappoint. But we will never be disappointed as long as we are disciples of the Good Shepherd!
